What is a Vaudiotext?


While teaching languages, I realized that information presented in video, audio and text format <u>at the same time</u> is retained much more effectively than text or audio or videos alone. I only use natural voices reading, and layout the text so that readers can focus on the information. Literature can enhanced with a natural reading voice, while non-fiction information can be supported with graphics, text and page numbers.

I format the text on each page so that sentences and paragraphs are separated naturally and graphics support the information. Feel free to browse through the Vaudiotexts on our website to see what we've done so far.


Here are 3 reasons to use Vaudiotexts to get your message out.

1. Allow your audience the option to hear a natural voice reading your message while visually reading this text. Readers can also switch between hearing only and reading only and go back to review complex information at their convenience. Here's a quick example:

In the Japanese writing system, stroke order is important. Here is a Hiragana character with the stroke order and direction labled 1, 2, and 3.



2. Get more traffic online by having your information available as videos as well as texts. Notice that videos often rank higher in Google searches. Here is an image to support this information:
